

Overview

Aim

- Have a willingness, commitment and ability cooperate with the deadlines and timeframes set out in the preparatory process


A detailed programme will be sent out in October.

Finances

A participation fee to make a contribution towards accommodation, food and programme costs. The participation fee per person is:

- 60 EUR for participants from Western and Northern Europe,
- 40 EUR for participants from Eastern Europe and the Caucasus.

We do not want costs to be barrier so if the fee would be a deterrent to your participation, then we would encourage you to contact the IFM-SEI secretariat.

Travel

Full travel reimbursement will be offered up to a reference price set by the European Commission:

- For travel distances between 10 and 99KM: 20 EUR per participant
- For travel distances between 100 and 499 KM: 180 EUR per participant
- For travel distances between 500 and 1999 KM: 275 EUR per participant
- For travel distances between 2000 and 2999 KM: 360 EUR per participant

About the Venue

Mühlfunviertel Grenzlandcamp Klaffer Vorderanger 16 4163 Klaffer am Hochficht Austria

The project will be held at the Mühlfunviertel in Klaffer am Hochficht. It is situated in the northern province of Upper Austria and close to the borders to Germany and the Czech Republic. The venue is located in a rural mountain and forest area next to a lake, and it has







loads of space for outdoor activities and sessions. Kinderfreunde have used this facility in the past with positive feedback from participants.

The house is equipped with seminar rooms and equipment such as flip charts, projector, sound system, etc. In addition, the venue offers table tennis, table football and other leisure time activities on site.

How to get there:

Option A: Participants arrive by plane in Vienna or Linz and from there they go by train (via Linz) to Aigen /Schlägl. In Aigen/Schlägl participants are picked up by the project team with a van or if not possible or too late by a cab.

Option B: An arrival at the Munich Airport with a subsequent trip by train to Passau is also possible.

Please be aware that you will need to allocate part of your budget for travelling in Austria. In best case you let us know until the registration deadline 15 September 2022 the planned arrival and departure time and we will support you in planning your travel within Austria.
